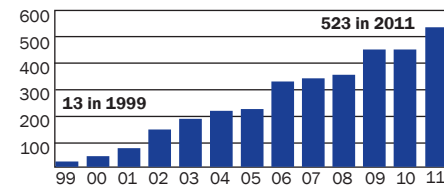

partnerships

From its earliest days, Macon State has recognized the vital relationship that exists between Robins Air Force Base and the Central Georgia economy. In 1970, only two years after the college opened, a resident center was established on the base for the educational needs of airmen, families and base workers. In 2003, the city of Warner Robins donated 72 acres to Macon State for a permanent campus. The base and the college have collaborated on a co-op program that directly prepares students for specific jobs at the base, and the college has introduced programs in government contracting, lean production and operations management -- all in direct response to workforce needs at Robins.
