

CPC Requirements

College Preparatory Curriculum

All applicants for programs leading to the baccalaureate degree who graduated from high school less than five years before the term they plan to enroll are required to complete the high school College Preparatory Curriculum (CPC) as specified by the University System of Georgia. (See the Academic Catalog for more information.)

Which courses should a student take to satisfy CPC deficiencies?

- **CPC English** – Based upon the COMPASS score, individual students may (1) exempt Learning Support English and/or Reading or (2) be placed in Learning Support English (ENGL 0099) and/or Reading (READ 0099).
- **CPC Mathematics** – Based upon the COMPASS score, individual students may (1) exempt Learning Support Mathematics or (2) be placed in Learning Support Mathematics at the appropriate level, either MATH 0097 or MATH 0099. However, MATH 0099 must be completed to satisfy the CPC requirement.
- **CPC Science** - BIOL 1001K or PHSC 1011K and earn at least a "C" in the course.
- **CPC Social Sciences** - HIST 1111 or 1112 and earn at least a "C" in the course.
- **CPC Foreign Language** - FREN 1001 or SPAN 1001 and earn at least a "C" in the course.

Important Information!

- CPC courses will **NOT** count towards degree requirements.
- Students **must** earn at least a "C" in each of these CPC courses. CPC classes are computed in the student's Grade Point Average.
- Entering freshmen **must** take these courses by the time they have earned 30 semester hours of credit. Transfer students must take these courses immediately upon entering or as soon as possible thereafter.
- **BANNER REMINDER:** If a student is registering for a course to fulfill a CPC requirement, **advisors MUST change the Grade Mode from an "N" to a "C" in SFAREGS.**
