- **Steve Sanchez** “*Design Principles: Aesthetic, Environmental, and Economic Considerations*” During the design process landscape architects consider the aesthetic qualities of plants for the enjoyment of the user, but also find themselves examining the environmental effects of the design, and the economic opportunities and limitations of the decisions made. This talk will analyze some specific details of these three issues.
